

CPAC Meeting Minutes
June 12, 2025

Roll call: Eric Stender, Marilyn Stout, Grace Irvin, Nancy Robertson, Carl Duewer, Tyler Wenger, Jordan Harris, Betty Edison, Pam Johnson, Dominic Valenti and Tracy Olson.

Eric opened the meeting at 11AM and asked for a motion to accept the minutes from the May meeting. Nancy moved to accept the minutes. Betty seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: The report showed a balance of \$7,423.81, which included the proceeds from the May IGA cookout. Carl moved to accept the report. Nancy seconded. Motion carried.

Old business:

ICGS Links-Character of a Champion was completed. It was suggested that next year it would be presented at a fall assembly. Other activities completed include the C3 mentoring lunch, CPAC scholarship awards and the May 31st IGA cookout. Another cookout is scheduled for June 28th from 9:30-11.

New business:

Chestnut- The alcohol campaign surveys are out. Responses will help to plan for next year. IYS is this coming year. Chestnut will push for January-February participation.

The grant for the Impacted Youth project is still alive with three years of curriculum.

Screenagers is a new program for the junior high and high school which offers movies and parent information.

Eric said he was interested in a program that would promote a vape free life style. He suggested working with local businesses to offer free or discounted golf games or workouts as incentives. Perhaps it could be a family challenge. Grace said that Chestnut has these programs. One is called "Brief Intervention".

In August, Logan-Mason ROSC is hosting an event called "Breaking Barriers". This will be held in Lincoln in partnership with the Lincoln PD.

CPAC will have a table at the fall orientations. Chestnut will provide folders or bags with a link to parent survival kits and a link to the Mason County Directory.

C3 Mentoring- There are 45 sophomore students and ideas for new mentors are needed.

Monthly C3 mentoring meetings and the pre-meetings for the mentors will be held in the professional development space at the grade school.

Eric will check on the availability of the school to have a meeting for new mentors on August 18th. He suggested having new mentors meet at 6 PM and all mentors meet at 7 PM. He will send an email when the time and date are finalized. The first meeting with students will be on September 3rd.

Feedback- Students seemed to like using the personality tests which helped to spark conversation. The school is purchasing indicators for next year. Eric suggested having pods in place at the October meeting and focusing on personality traits during the first semester and

character traits during the second semester. Some thought character traits should be touched on earlier in the year. There was discussion about time constraints and how to make the meetings more personal so that mentors could get to know their students better.

Student leaders- Olivia Golden and Regan Harris have attended 5 CPAC meetings or events during the past school year. Xavier Stark has attended 4.

Menard Electric Grant- Tracy moved to apply for the Menard Electric grant. Carl seconded. Motion carried.

Drug-Free Grant- A committee meeting for the drug free grant will be held on June 25th at 1:30 PM. Members should bring ideas for different sectors and questions about goals and use of funds. Chestnut will look up priorities for Mason County.

Confirmation of the next meeting: The meeting will be on August 14th with the time to be set depending upon school dismissal.
